
# WELCOME TO TESS 2018!

Concurrent sessions take place on Floors 16 and 17. Meals and breaks are provided on Floor 17. Stairs and accessible elevators are available to move between floors.



## **SIMON BATES**The Anatomy of a 21st Century Educator: Pathways to institutional support

Simon Bates is Associate Provost, Teaching and Learning at UBC, with leadership responsibility for teaching, learning, and technology support to faculty and departments creating credit and non-credit learning opportunities spanning areas of undergraduate, graduate, and lifelong learning at UBC. The portfolio also contributes to new program approval and quality assurance processes overseen by the office of the Provost and Vice-President Academic. He is also a tenured Professor of Teaching in the Physics and Astronomy department.



## **ROBIN DEROSA**Empowering Tech: On Oxymorons, Objectives, and Open Education

Robin DeRosa's current research and advocacy work focus on Open Education, and how universities can innovate in order to bring down costs for students, increase interdisciplinary collaboration, and refocus the academic world on strengthening the public good. She is a professor at Plymouth State University, part of the University System of New Hampshire, where she directs the Interdisciplinary Studies program. She is also an editor for *Hybrid Pedagogy*, an open-access, peer-reviewed journal.
