



# PAID EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING OPPORTUNITY with the eCampusOntario SXD Lab

The eCampusOntario Student Experience Design (SXD) Lab is an innovation hub that tackles some of the most complex problems facing post-secondary education today. The focus is on student-<u>led</u> innovation. Why? Because students have historically been excluded from meaningful participation in the design and operation of the higher education system that exists to serve them.

This year, the SXD Lab is leading the creation of a series of open templates to support experiential learning (EL). What is experiential learning? This definition from Lewis and Williams (1994) is a helpful starting point: "In its simplest form, experiential learning means learning from experience or learning by doing. Experiential education first immerses learners in an experience and then encourages reflection about the experience to develop new skills, new attitudes, or new ways of thinking."

The eCampusOntario SXD Lab is recruiting energetic and industrious students to participate in a meta-experiential learning opportunity to design a series of templates for EL activities. The designed templates are intended to help solve the problem of *how might we help institutions scale experiential learning with technology.* We're testing a hypothesis that you can help co-design, to help future students access meaningful experiential, work-integrated learning opportunities.

# ELIGIBILITY:

All Ontario publicly-funded college or university domestic students (or recent graduate – one year or less) from any discipline are eligible if they meet the following requirements:

- 1. Capable of working productively in virtual and office environments;
- 2. Able to commit approximately 30-35 hours of in-person and virtual work;
- 3. Able to work and meet deliverables as part of a team;
- 4. Able to work in English;
- 5. Have access to a computer;
- 6. Reside in Ontario;
- 7. Graduating from a college or university program within a year or two.

Please note that workloads may fluctuate depending on deliverables and requirements. A high tolerance for ambiguity is necessary. If duties are not being met, contracts may be terminated with sufficient notice.
