





MICRO-CREDENTIAL DESCRIPTION

The Indigenous Doula Birthworker Postpartum Course will provide participants with knowledge of postpartum physiology and the process of recovery for mom and baby. Participants will learn the importance of providing support to new families with the transition into parenthood which includes infant care, feeding, recovery and healthy habits. Importants stills will include postpartum relationships, nutrition for family and baby, breastfeeding support as well as information for assistance with other feeding options. Participants will also learn about postpartum depression and how to watch for mood concerns and provide support for new moms, providing emotional, physical, and mental care during the postpartum period. Participants will also learn about challenges and special circumstances as well as specific indigenous knowledge, ceremonies, and teachings related to postpartum. 




